



My Fellow Companions,

The Ground Hog did not see his shadow, and if I have the Folk Lore Correct, it means we will have an early Spring. Based on the weather the whole nation has been experiencing this Winter, that would be welcome, but I suspect it may be problematical. I think a second opinion like the Farmer's Almanac may be in order. But by the time you read this letter the Cherry Blossoms should be peaking out in Washington and the birds may be abandoning us here in the South and headed toward all of you Northerners. That would include Virginia despite how much Virginians may resist considering themselves Northerners. So be it. Time marches on and we have work to do.

In our last Newsletter I mentioned new initiatives that were approved by the Annual Congress held last October in Sparks/Reno, Nevada. Specifically it was decided to proceed with the development and installation of an Interpretive Marker to be placed adjacent to the Statue of Commodore John Barry in Franklin Park in Washington, D.C. We also approved the project to build a Memorial Statue of Admiral Chester Nimitz. Obviously these projects cost money.

The Barry Wayside Marker will be in the neighborhood of \$8,000. The initial estimate for the Statue of Admiral Nimitz is approximately \$250,000.

As the Nimitz Project proceeds and we have greater definition regarding its design and location, more accurate cost estimates will emerge. At that time the Naval Order Foundation will embark on a Fund-raising campaign, similar to that which was conducted



the Normandy Monument. As with the Normandy Monument, we will need "seed money" to prepare brochures, conduct mail-outs to prospective donors, acquire gratuities such as commemorative coins, and potential advertising costs.

Past Commander Generals Ken Johnson and Carter Conlin appealed to membership for this seed money and you responded generously with donations that totaled approximately \$30,000 on both occasions.

Last year we conducted our first "Annual Appeal" and your response was also most generous. We obtained sufficient funds to pay off all Normandy Monument Costs, our contribution to the digitization of Admiral Nimitz's War Diaries, his "Grey Book", and still have money left in the Foundation Accounts. I am appealing to you again this year to generously contribute to these Naval Order Mission Oriented activities. A letter of appeal will be sent out to all members.

For Annual dues paying members the Appeal Letter will be included with your dues renewal notices. This will save us a considerable amount of postal costs. Please pay close attention to this mail-out and be as generous as you can in supporting our Memorial Projects. Separate letters will be mailed to our Life Members and again I ask for your generous support. A donor card will be included allowing you to pledge your donation over time, if you like, and to specify how you would like your donation to be applied, either to the Barry Marker or the Nimitz Project.

Finally, I urge you once again to make your reservations for the Congress to be held this year in Galveston, Texas. I have been in contact with Dave Burr, The Congress Chairman for the Host Commandery, the Texas Commandery, and a very attractive program is shaping up. As in past years, there are very interesting local trips in the Galveston area, that I know will be of great enjoyment. Check out the Registration form included in this Newsletter for details on the trips to local attractions. We also have important business to review including the Barry Historical Marker, the Nimitz project and others. We will also be electing a new slate of officers. Of special interest is the attendance of our Distinguished Sea Service Award recipient, Admiral Thad Allen, USCG (Ret). His major leadership role in the recovery from Hurricane Katrina and the BP Oil Spill tragedies should provide unique insights we could otherwise never receive. Looking forward to seeing you in Galveston".

# Commodore John Barry Interpretive Marker Project

The National Capitol Commandery is making good progress with the marker development. Joining the project committee of Bill Dudley, John Rodgaard and Kent Siegel is Ranger Michael Kelly, our working contact with the National Park Service. Michael is an avid student of naval history and has joined the Naval Order and is proving to be a very enthusiastic participant. A rough layout for the marker design and an eye-catching text of 100 words (NPS limit) has been composed that gives the gist of why we honor Barry as an American naval hero. The graphics will consist principally of a famous portrait of Barry and paintings of several sea battles in which Barry's ships were victorious over the British. As we plan ahead, the design must be complete by mid November so the manufacturing process for the porcelain panel can be bid and completed by mid March 2012.

Our tentative dedication date would miraculously fall on St. Patrick's Day. Wouldn't that put a twinkle in the eye of the great Irish-American sea fighter whom we venerate. Speaking of the Irish, the committee has established a friendly relationship with Washington Area members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians. We have joined them on several social occasions and have received a wealth of important material on their interest in John Barry's life and naval career. Moreover they've given us some unique information on the Barry statue in Franklin Park in Washington, DC for which their order was a key sponsor and participant in the elaborate dedication ceremony in 1914. ## USS Constitution Included in SNDL Update from CAPT Chris Melhuish, 65th Commanding Officer

Earlier this year CAPT Chris Melhuish, USN (Ret) was perusing the Navy's Standard Navy Distribution List and noticed that the CONSTITUTION was not in either the Fleet or Shore administrative chains of command and made available the appropriate extract from the National Defense Authorization Act that designates Old Ironsides as America's Ship of State to the SNDL "custodian".

This resulted in the ship being properly recognized in the SNDL not only as a direct report to CNO but also listed as the US Ship of State. As far as CAPT Meluish determine, this is the first time so recorded in an official US Navy document.
